Yale's records say that just about half of our classmates have never come back to New Haven for a 1963 Reunion. Perhaps you, like me, find the present either too good or too challenging to spend much time coming to New Haven to spend three days with guys we either never knew, or found difficult enough to take while we were trying to get an education and get out into the world.
