The 50th Reunion of our Class was a memorable occasion. Continuously sunny skies provided an excellent backdrop to the camaraderie and enthusiasm of the gathering.

Just over half of us were there in person – 421 classmates (50.3% of the Class) and 776 total attendees – which broke the prior record for percentage attendance at a Yale 50th reunion. The rest of us were there in spirit, and were very much recalled and missed throughout the weekend.

On Thursday, May 30, 2013, **Jere Johnston** presented the Class Survey, followed by the premiere of the Class Film. Each classmate who could not attend the Reunion will receive a DVD of the Class Film, together with a DVD of the Class Photo/Video Album created by **Jon Larson**. Following the premiere of the Class Film, filmmaker Rick Okie conducted a panel discussion with Dean Arthur Howe, who put together our Class more than 54 years ago.

On Friday, May 31, 2013, following Class discussion groups in the afternoon, we held our 50th Reunion Memorial Service in Battell Chapel, at which we remembered each of the 40 classmates who have died since our last reunion. On Saturday, June 1, 2013, **Jerry Kenney** chaired a Symposium on Yale Athletics, to which all reunion classes were invited and which drew a large audience. At lunch, we presented Yale Class of 1963 Teaching Awards to 19 teachers who are still remembered with gratitude from our days at Yale. Our classmates' talks about their teachers were poignant, nostalgic, and inspiring, and focused on the transformation of lives. Following another round of discussion groups in the afternoon, we ended the day in our Reunion headquarters, Davenport College, with music (including the return of the Thunderbirds led by **Chuck Lubar** and songs by **Billy Hamilton**), dancing, and quiet time for conversations among classmates.
